Please review this policy carefully. By continuing to use the Sites, you consent to the terms of this Cookie Policy.

### WHAT ARE COOKIES?

Cookies are unique identifiers, usually made up of small bits of text or code. Cookies are usually stored on your device or in your web browser and they send certain information back to the party who served the cookie. When we say cookies, we are actually referring to a broader range of technologies than just cookies, including web beacons, clear gifs, pixels and other similar technologies. When we say first-party cookies we mean cookies that are served by Sysdig. When we say third-party cookies, we mean cookies that are served by non-Sysdig parties.

### HOW ARE COOKIES USED?

Cookies are used in order to better understand how applications and websites work and to optimize online and mobile experiences. Cookies do this by allowing the party serving the cookie to analyze a websites or mobile apps performance, to remember user preferences, to recognize whether a computer or device (and probably its user) has visited a website previously, and to serve personalized advertisements. We may collect this information across browsers or devices, but the interest-based advertising cookie is not associated with and does not contain personal information.

### HOW CAN I OPT OUT OF COOKIES?

You may be able to change or withdraw your consent with the placement of certain cookies by configuring your browser settings, opting out directly with the party that operates and controls the cookie or through the cookie pop-up window on our Sites. Be aware that disabling cookies will affect the functionality of the Sites and many other websites that you visit. Disabling cookies will usually result in also disabling certain functionality and features of the Sites. Therefore, it is recommended that you do not disable cookies.

### WHAT DO WE DO WITH COLLECTED INFORMATION?

## WHAT KIND OF COOKIES ARE USED ON THE SITES?

### 1. Operationally Necessary Cookies

These cookies are essential for the operation of our Sites. They make it possible for you to browse and use our Sites by enabling basic functions like page navigation, access to secure areas of the website, provide social media features or analyze traffic. If you disable these cookies, the Sites will not function correctly.

### 2. Preference Cookies

These cookies are used to recognize and remember your preferences. For example, functionality cookies may use information, such as your location, to make sure that you arrive at a version of our Sites that is specific to your city, region or language.

### 3. Statistic Cookies

Statistic cookies help us understand how you interact with the Sites, they collect and report information anonymously.

### 4. Advertising Cookies

We use first party and allow third-party cookies on our Sites in order to deliver interest-based advertising content on third-party websites and applications. We, and third-party ad servers, use cookies to understand your interest in the advertisements and content delivered to you, as well as to serve you with more relevant ads based on your activities on our Sites. For example, cookies used for advertising could record information about whether you have clicked on certain content or advertisements on our Sites or other websites.

Arbor complies with the Digital Advertising Alliance's (DAA) Self-Regulatory Principles for Online Behavioral Advertising. You can read more about the principles and how interest-based ads work on the DAA's consumer education page.

Collection of your information by third parties is not governed by this Cookie Policy or our Privacy Policy. Please consult the privacy policies of those third parties to determine how they collect and use your personal information. Many third-party advertisers and some web browsers and mobile devices allow you to opt out of third-party advertising. ### 5. Account related cookies

If you create an account with Sysdig then we may use cookies for the management of the signup process and general administration. These cookies will usually be deleted when you log out however in some cases, they may remain afterwards to remember your site preferences when logged out.

### 6. Third Party Cookies

In some special cases we also use cookies provided by trusted third parties, such as Google Analytics, which is one of the most widespread and trusted analytics solutions on the web for helping us to understand how you use the Sites and ways that we can improve your experience. These cookies may track things such as how long you spend on the site and the pages that you visit so we can continue to produce engaging content. Additionally, we may use third-party cookies to track the performance of advertisements or collect IP addresses and other website navigational information on our Sites, emails and on third-party websites. These third-parties cookies provide information that allows us to tailor the advertisement of our products and services to your interests and helps us manage and track the effectiveness of our marketing efforts. ## 7. Login related cookies

We use cookies when you are logged in so that we can remember this fact. This prevents you from having to log in every single time you visit a new page. These cookies are typically removed or cleared when you log out to ensure that you can only access restricted features and areas when logged in.
